

This exhibit was created in close alliance with Steve's family.



Hard to Kill: Art by Survivors of Sexual Violence

This exhibit was inspired by conversations I had with leading curators and artists during my time as a graduate student, working on my thesis on how prevalent such abuses are in our society today. During my studies, prevalent voices in the art world dismissed my concerns or tried to steer my voice in a more vague direction. There could be many reasons for their advice, but what was consistent was how uncomfortable they were with the topic of sexual violence.

I have always believed that art could be a vehicle for awareness, so the numerous suggestions to make my work less about sexual abuse and more about generalized traumatic experiences didn't sit right with me. Sexual abuse is prevalent in our society, as 1 in 6 women, 1 in 10 men, and 1 in 5 of those in the transgender community will encounter such abuse in their lifetimes (SOURCE: rainn.org). With statistics like this that point to a larger problem, I knew my voice wasn't the only one out there, which is how "Hard to Kill" came to fruition. - Danielle Owensby, Agitator Artist / Curator


The Anti-Model Minority Show: Breaking the Myth

In the beginning of this year my grandmother passed away. Although she had lived in the United States since 1978, she had never learned to speak English fluently or drive a car, and she was okay with it. She was the cultural matriarch of our family and helped raise us from birth. She was the reason why Mandarin was our first language, why pork stew is our favorite food, and why we learned how to play mah-jong.

As the decades passed, she picked up different bits and pieces of American culture: a passion for recycling, Smarties candies, and watching her favorite show, Wheel of Fortune.

I was born and raised in the Midwest where I was one of two Asian American kids in my class. Throughout my life I have often found myself caught in between two conflicting cultural identities, *zhongguoren* or Chinese person and *waiguoren* or American person. (Ironically the word for foreigner is synonymous for American in Mandarin).

This is common among immigrants and first-generation Americans but not something that is often represented in popular culture. I wanted to give my peers a space to voice their experiences while confronting the Model Minority Myth. Simultaneously challenging the idea of what it means to be American and the definition of American culture. - Jen Lau, Agitator Artist / Curator

As the exhibition progresses, the food rots, creating an uncomfortable situation for the observer who faces the hidden laborers.






Rostros Indigenas – Miguel Akira Mar




Nothing About Us Without Us – Chicago Recovery Alliance Benefit [Luna Rail Video Interview on Agitator Instagram](#)

Since 1991 the Chicago Recovery Alliance (CRA) has distributed clean, safe equipment for safe drug use and condoms for safe sex. They have become the largest distributor and educator on the use of free Naloxone in the midwest. They have collected data on their work and contributed to invaluable research that shows that harm reduction indisputably saves lives.

Seen in these photos is the Wall of T-Shirts. These t-shirts are sold by agencies from the US, Puerto Rico, and the UK to fund their work and bring dialogue to the public about harm reduction. The second photo is an installation shot of a Photo Voice (art / research) Project organized and led by CRA's research director, Suzanne Carlsburg-Rascich. The photos are by CRA participants who were asked to take photos illustrating questions like, "How do you experience judgment for your drug use in this community?" and "What needs to change about how the community treats you as a person who injects drugs?" These questions were developed primarily by CRA participants. Individuals were asked not to take any identifying photos so as to protect themselves and others from legal / police retaliation. – Luna Rail, Agitator Artist / Curator



Lights On - Artist in Residence Rebeca Soto

Rebeca Soto is a scorpio chicana illustrator based in Chicago. Her mixed media illustrations aim to provoke viewers by giving them visual accessibility to the authentic experiences of femme sexuality. Her figures are influenced by traditional Mexican colors and textures, decaying plant matter, and juxtaposing feelings of lust, passion, and anxiety. Using combined creative methods, Rebeca's works act as a process of mindfulness and self-care. She hopes her works can be accessible forms of conversation and education.

As our second Artist In Residence, Rebeca presented her solo show in a socially distanced window display. Earlier in her residency, she held a drawing workshop for womxn and nonbinary makers called *Babes Make*, which she continued online after Lockdown.

AND THEN: Stories About What Happens Next [Virtual Gallery](#)

And Then is a printed book and virtual gallery of art, poems, fiction, performance, and essays about our visions of the future. What do we hope for? What do we fear? What do we think it will take to get there? All of us are thinking about changes, how they are changing us, and how they will change our future.

And Then focuses on these changes. Both the book and the virtual gallery include the work of over forty artists and writers. The participants include emerging artists, career creatives, and first-time creators. The online exhibit includes all the visual art and writing from the book, plus video selections, and audio files of the writers reading their own work.

And Then is a phrase that marks a turning point. When we hit a turning point, we may be gripped by fear; but we also yearn for the possibilities brought on by change.

Everything is in question, and speaking our truth gives it gravity. It reminds us who we are and where we are, in a time of deliberate chaos that is designed to make us forget both.

Telling our own stories means we control the narrative, and it also means we have a better chance of harnessing the turning point.



Sex Workers Art Zine and Website

Since our founding 15 years ago, a major component of SWOP Chicago's mission has been to create affirming cultural spaces where local sex workers can enjoy and express ourselves, free from the violence and stigma that so often defines the rest of our lives. For most of that time, Chicago Sex Workers Art Show has been an annual highlight of the SWOP social calendar. No one anticipated that our opening on March 7, 2020 would be the last public event we threw - or that most members of our community attended - for a year and counting. Within a week, Illinois was under a stay-at-home order, Agitator had closed its space, and SWAS went virtual.

As we approached March 3, 2021 - International Sex Workers Rights Day, which the Art Show has traditionally marked - we knew we wanted to come up with ways to showcase sex-worker talent, even if that couldn't include be an in-person event. This zine is one of the results of that brainstorm. Another is the Chicago SWAS 2021 online gallery. - Kathy Rosenfeld, SWOP Chicago
